

# Is Your Organization Too Lean for Safety?

While lean operations are good for business, running too lean can increase risk.

## Warning Signs That Your Organization Is Too Lean for Safety

- 1 Near Miss Reporting drops off due to time constraints and/or lack of follow-up
- 2 Safety Work Order turnaround time increases as maintenance employees are stretched thin
- 3 Supervisors have little time in the field observing work and interacting with workers
- 4 Safety participation and engagement drops off as people focus more on workload
- 5 Turnover and/or callouts increase as burnout sets in
- 6 Prolonged frustration, exhaustion, and stress leads to more turnover—creating a vicious cycle



## Maximizing Safety When Running Lean

- 1 Focus on a critical few safety-related activities to avoid overwhelming busy employees
- 2 Ensure frontline supervisors have time for safety interactions to address hazards and observe workers
- 3 Prompt leaders to increase their use of helpful feedback and positive reinforcement for critical safety-related behaviors
- 4 Create a positive accountability system to ensure preventative safety leader behaviors get prioritized
- 5 Listen to employees' concerns
- 6 Be diligent about responding to unsafe conditions, near misses, etc.
